Language requirements

Engineering courses: French B1+ / English B1+
Agrofood Chain Master course: English B2

Study requirements for incoming students

The learning agreement should contain at least **20 ECTS per semester**, in the **same engineering specialisation or Master course**. Students will need to have proven records in the prerequisites to follow the courses they wish to enroll in.

Grading policy

Our grading system requires a minimum score of 10 to validate every Academic Unit (UE). It is a 20-point scale with the following scores:

0-<8 = fail

≥8-10 = students can take another exam in 2nd session,

10 = average, (≈ GPA of 2)

12 = good, (≈ GPA of 3)

14 = very good, (≈ GPA of 3.7)

≥16 = excellent, (≈ GPA of 4.33)

18 and above = congratulations.

In practice, outstanding students get a score ≥15. (≈ GPA of 4)

Miscellaneous

University Hall of residence (CROUS)

This can be booked for one or two semesters through the ENSAT accommodation services.

Cost of living

Accommodation: ≈250-300 €/month (CROUS Dormitories) and as from 300 €/month (private). Governmental housing allowance can be requested by www.caf.fr
Public transport (bus, tram and metro) 18€ per year for the pass card and 10 €/month for students <26 years of age
University restaurants : 3.25€/meal

Insurances

1. Civil liability insurance (compulsory) ≈ 15€/ year, payment on registration
2. Household liability (compulsory) ≈ 25€/year
Some insurances(www.assurances-etudiants.com) cover both civil liability & accommodation ≈ 30€ / year
3. Free health insurance through the governmental policy (refunds 70% of medical cost)
4. Complementary health insurance (highly recommended in the event of surgery) : 18€/year (refunds about 30% of most medical costs)
5. EU students are requested to travel with their European Insurance card.
